At a Glance

Formed in 1999, the San Diego Long Term Care Integration Project (LTCIP) has worked to develop a comprehensive, person-centered, integrated continuum of care that maintains individual dignity. This allows consumers of long-term services and supports (LTSS) to remain an integral part of their family and community. LTCIP members include over 800 stakeholders representing health care and service providers; older and disabled consumers; advocates; and local, state, and national policy leaders that convene quarterly. The LTCIP is focused on providing the infrastructure for regional collaboration to improve health care and LTSS for older adults and persons with disabilities, as well as the planning and implementation of the Coordinated Care Initiative and Cal MediConnect programs.
