The Adult & Aging Network (AAN) was created in 1999 as an advisory body to the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors. Its mission is to facilitate connection, collaboration, education and advocacy among stakeholders and service providers to improve the lives of older adults and people with disabilities. Bi-monthly meetings support coordination of existing services and identify priority needs and concerns in the areas of health, human services, education, safety and community access. Membership includes public, private and non-profit agencies, funders and community volunteers. The AAN is committed to creating a responsive and supportive community where all people can age with dignity, choice and independence. It merged with the Central Coast LTSS Coalition, led by the Independent Living Resource Center, in 2016.
