

San Francisco Long Term Care Coordinating Council

At a Glance

The San Francisco Long Term Care Coordinating Council (LTCCC) was created in 2004 to provide policy guidance to the mayor's office. The Council's mission is to advise, implement, and monitor community-based, long-term care planning; and to improve the coordination of home, community-based, and institutional services for older adults and people with disabilities. LTCCC has 40 members, representing consumers, advocates, and service providers. Additional representation includes city and county departments: Aging and Adult Services, Public Health, Mayor's Office on Disability and Housing, San Francisco Housing Authority, and the Municipal Transit Authority. LTCCC focuses on how service delivery systems interact to serve people and recommends ways to improve coordination and system interaction. In 2018, LTCCC and the Dignity Fund Coalition will produce a candidate town hall event for the mayoral candidates of the summer mayoral election.
